Related Legislation - HB 5026 appropriates money to DHS

Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) provide vital supports to people with I/DD and directly effect the health and safety of thousands of Oregonians on a daily basis. Restructuring the rates paid to DSPs will:

- Stabilize the workforce by reducing turnover
- Improve the lives of people with I/DD who rely on DSPs
- Reduce amount paid to DSPs by government for public aid



6,000 DSPs receive

in public aid due to low wages

Protection for people under Guardianship

Guardianship should only be used as a last resort when other less-restrictive types of support have been exhausted. Guardians must be held accountable for the way in which they support the protected person.

SB376

Requires notice be sent to the protected person when guardian is appointed

SB682

Requires court to appoint & pay for legal counsel for a person in some circumstances

SB683 HB2601

Protects a person's ability to maintain desired relationships
